Dear Ms. Fox:

The State of Washington requests that the enclosed percents be used to calculate allotments for Washington Indian Tribes and Tribal Organizations that receive direct federal Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) funding from the Department of Health and Human Services. The state requests that these numbers be effective beginning for the fiscal year 1998 and that they remain in effect until further notice.

In cases where Washington tribes have not submitted applications for direct federal LIHEAP funding for a fiscal year by September 1 preceding the start of the fiscal year, the state concurs with acceptance of these tribes' applications if the Office of Community Services receives the applications by November 15 of the fiscal year (or, if November 15 is on a Saturday or Sunday, by the next working day).

CALCULATION OF WASHINGTON TRIBAL DIRECT LIHEAP ALLOTMENTS

To calculate the allotment of each Indian tribe and tribal organization in the State of Washington that is to receive direct federal LIHEAP funding, multiply the factor below for the tribe or tribal organization by the state's gross LIHEAP allotment.
